recognized as the home of Tears of Gettysburg and Rebel Red wines, guests at the winery also enjoy wines such as their estate grown Cabernet and Chambourcin blend, their bright and refreshing Stray Cat Strut, the complex and unique Three Ships to the Wind or the decadent Black Magic. Adams County Winery produces a series of fun, small batch, seasonal wines each year.

The luscious wines at Adams County Winery have won many distinguished awards. Here is a list of some of their most celebrated wines:

- Tears of Gettysburg: 29-time award winner including 4 Best in Class Medals, 1 Double Gold, and 5 Gold Medals
- Rebel Red: 24-time award winner including 2 Best in Class Medals, 2 Double Gold Medals, and 3 Gold Medals
- Scrapple: 8-time award winner including 3 Gold Medals
- Stray Cat Strut: 8-time award winner including 1 Best in Class and 1 Gold Medal
- Black Magic: 7-time award winner including 1 Gold Medal and a Silver Medal at the 2017 Texas International Wine Competition
